

What to do before and after publishing

– a short guide on open science repositories in IChF

Before publication:

Not obligatory but recommended: publish a preprint (submitted version of the article, before reviews) on <https://chemrxiv.org/> or another preprint server.

If it was a research article, deposit the selected **research data** in the IChF collection in the *Repository for Open Data RepOD*: (<https://repod.icm.edu.pl/dataverse/ichf>) on a CC-BY or CC0 license.

The reviewers may ask you to give them access to the data earlier. You can deposit the data in RepOD and send them private links, while setting an embargo period on the dataset, so it will be publicly available later.

If you have a lot of data and trouble with choosing what to deposit ask prof. Anders Martin Jönsson-Niedziółka: martinj@ichf.edu.pl

You will need to show these datasets in the yearly NCN project reports.

After publication:

If it was an open access article: Immediately after publication deposit a copy (version of record, **VoR** – a PDF downloaded from the journal website) of the article in the IChF collection in *OPEN - the Repository of Open Scientific Publications* (<https://open.icm.edu.pl/communities/82c01d07-fee3-4718-88da-5d64c789653d>) on the same license as in the journal.

If it was a subscription model article: Check the journal embargo period on **AAM** (accepted version of the manuscript – after reviews, but without journal formatting). You can check it on the journal website, in Sherpa-Romeo: <https://openpolicyfinder.jisc.ac.uk/> or ask the IChF Library.

After the embargo period deposit the AAM in the IChF collection in *OPEN - the Repository of Open Scientific Publications* (<https://open.icm.edu.pl/communities/82c01d07-fee3-4718-88da-5d64c789653d>) on any license allowed by the publisher (CC-BY if possible).
